The Principles of Attack

Course Description

Our course is both practical & theoretical in nature. You will be provided with a more in depth knowledge of how to improve both your individual player's performance and your team's performance too. You will be introduced to the Jigsaw Analogy or Whole-Part-Whole teaching process.

Weekly

We will first review the teaching and learning elements involved in the WPW then we will proceed to the Turf Field to show the course participants **how** to use this most effective process to improve their teaching of the Elements of Attacking Play: **Width-Depth-Mobility-Improvisation and Penetration along with the Sub-sets of each.**

There will be a classroom segment prior to the practical coaching segment in the gym or dome. Working with Tony Harrison the course designer and Facilitator participants will be coached as players then together with their peers they will dissect the practice content and process through group observations and questions along with input from Tony.

You will then be given a suitable topic to prepare a practice on and along with 3 or 4 course members you will plan & present your topic using other course members as players. 1 or 2 members of your planning group will act as coaches of the topic. Course Facilitator Tony Harrison will help with the process as needed. Through this Guided Discovery Method your teaching skills will be enhanced.

The Tools of the Trade

Grid Work, Freeze Play, Conditioned Play, Drill Work, Directing Play, Repetitive Pressure, Shadow Play, Functional Practice, Phase Play, Coaching in the game, Motivation & Player Performance, Setting Achievable Targets Whole Part Whole Methodology, the Feedback Loop, Game Analysis, Observing Video or Game Footage on a given topic and reporting your findings, The Movement Approach to teaching Motor Skills. This course will involve many of the preceding areas of teaching and learning.
